

Arizona Catholic Conference 2004 Voter's Guide Questions

- Education** — Parental choice should be expanded through tax credits or vouchers to allow children to attend any public, private, religious or home school.
- Abortion** — Abortion providers should be required to provide “informed consent” information about the medical and psychological risks, fetal development, abortion alternatives and to allow the woman a 24-hour period to review the information.
- Abortion** — Healthcare facilities and health professionals should not be exempt from mandates to provide or facilitate services related to surgical abortions or “emergency contraception,” even though they may violate religious or moral beliefs.
- Welfare** — The government should exclude newborn children conceived while their mothers were receiving welfare from the calculation of the family's welfare cash grant.
- Death Penalty** — The death penalty should be prohibited for people who were under age 18 at the time of a criminal offense.
- Health** — Cloning of human embryos for all purposes should be allowed, including the creation of and trafficking in cloned human embryos, both embryonic and experimental.
- Health** — Physician-assisted suicide for terminally ill patients should be legalized.
- Immigration** — Non-citizens should be allowed to obtain a driver's license.
- Immigration** — State and local government agencies, including police departments, should be prohibited from accepting matricula consular cards as a form of identification.
- Marriage** — Congress should pass, and Arizona should ratify, an amendment to the U.S. Constitution stating marriage is the union of one man and one woman.
